

"Give her money back to her; I will pay for it." A man in a checkout line spoke these words to a cashier. They were one aisle over, and I had to turn around to see where these words of kindness had come from. The older woman, for whom he had offered to pay for her groceries, froze and was in a state of speechless surprise. The surrounding customers began telling her, "You have just been blessed!" Finally able to speak, the woman said, "Yes, I have been blessed." She kept saying thank you to the man who had made the offer.

There were two customers between him and the woman. He maneuvered toward the cashier, took out his wallet, and paid for the woman's groceries. He then returned to his position in line. All of us who experienced this kind gesture had a fixed smile. I felt honored to have witnessed such a good deed.

This incident, which occurred during the Lenten season in preparation for the Easter celebration, had me thinking about what Jesus said to His Father... I will pay for it. Before Jesus came to earth, He saw us in line and knew we needed the ultimate act of love and kindness. He volunteered to take our accumulated debt of sin, which we could not pay, and offered to pick up the tab.

Sin, or hamartia in Greek, means "to miss the mark." Jesus said, give their efforts to pay their debt back to them; they will keep missing the mark. By My grace, I will pay for it.

Just as the man saw the woman in the store and maneuvered to where she was, Jesus maneuvered His way to us. Aren't you glad You accepted the offer? Pray that others will do the same. His offer still stands.

Dear Father, we thank You for Your Son's request to pay the price for our sin. The food items the man purchased for the woman will last for a time, but what Jesus purchased for us is everlasting.
