

My sister lives in a gated subdivision. Upon entering, you must have the gate's code or call to be buzzed in to open the gate. To reach her house, you must travel through a series of twists and turns. When it is time to leave her home, you travel the same twists and turns to reach the gate to exit the subdivision. However, when leaving, a code or call is not needed. Just stop and wait; like magic, the iron gate will open on its own, allowing you to depart.

While waiting at the gate to return home one day, I thought about Apostle Peter's experience of an iron gate opening itself, allowing him to escape. Unlike my pleasant stay and anticipation of future visits, Peter fled from impending danger, not wanting to return.

King Herod apprehended Peter with the intent to execute him. Peter was shackled between two guards while additional guards were at the prison gate. The night before Peter was to stand trial, an angel of the Lord roused Peter and aided him in his escape. Peter's chains miraculously fell off his hands during the process. He followed the angel through the iron gate, which led him safely to the city.

Life's trials can have twists and turns, often making us feel trapped in a dark, suffocating cell with no way out. We wait, we pray, but the problem persists, growing more menacing. Our faith is tested in these moments, and we must hold on, trusting in God's power to do the impossible.

Waiting is not passive; it is an active choice to trust God's timing, wisdom, and purpose. In these moments of waiting and experiencing God destroying the chains that held us bound, we truly grasp the authority of His love, the trustworthiness of His promises, and the depth of His care for us.

Please wait at the gate—it will open.
